100 years ago- June 1917

It had been a wet year with heavy rainfall closing roads and bridges. Although there was no recording of the weather in Warkworth district, it was estimated that 80-100 inches of rain had fallen in the year to May. In Auckland city, 80-90 inches were recorded and "if there's anything the district can beat the city in, it's rainfall." The Roads Board reported that slips between Whangateau and Leigh had been cleared enough to allow ordinary traffic through; and several slips cleared between Pakiri and Leigh. Work would be completed during summer.

Farm life was increasingly difficult: extra costs and fewer young men. Farmers and orchardists continued to protest about the butterfat levy and orchard tax. The butterfat levy was 'another tax' in disguise under the War Regulations, the Minister of Agriculture had 'his hand in their pockets'. Whereas a man on a salary of £250 was untaxed, a farmer earning the same from butterfat was charged £20. At a meeting held in the library the Fruitgrowers' Assn decided to form a separate association of those who paid the orchard tax to add to the names nationally to

Thank you to Peter Spence for keeping you all informed whilst I was away enjoying spring in the Cotswolds.

A healthy number of people attended the Matheson Bay Neighbourhood Association AGM and the report presented on the Kohuroa stream track upgrade was very encouraging. What had started out by Lydia Smith as a 'weed bee' last year, is now a full scale upgrade of the track protecting the Kauri trees and the great biodiversity. A grant by the Rodney Local Board and acknowledgement by Auckland Council that the area is of value and should be preserved has been well received by MBNA and volunteers.

Following from this, regular 'weed bees' are to be held to rid the bay of agapanthus in drains and on verges. The first of these will be held on 1 and 2nd July and volunteers are asked to come armed with spades and grubbers. Morning tea will be provided and these have previously made the effort well worthwhile. Volunteers will be notified of the streets to be weeded by email or if you are not on the database and would like to help please phone Secretary Peter Spence on 021 404 529.




Forest and Bird COMMUNITY COAST CARE GROUP

They are removing all pest plants mothplant, pampas, locquats, agapanthus, acmena, jasmine, honeysuckle, Madiera vine etc and doing a very thorough job. Given that we now have three active environment groups in our little village, it is great to feel



we have the Department of Conservation as our active partners. We were delighted to receive a grant from Leigh Community and Ex Services Club. Already we have bought some new hand tools. Also delighted to hear that the Matheson Bay group is to have weed removal working bees, and is also targeting the removal of agapanthus. Fantastic. Thanks to Auckland Council for supplying 300 plants for our coastal



areas. Thanks also to those who have offered to help plant them. Most will be infill planting on the walkway between Kyle St and Wonderview Road. Once they're in we'll hibernate for a couple of months until the ground dries out a bit.

After the brigade had their busiest January to April (43 callouts), May saw them attend just one incident, a medical call to Leigh Wharf. Less callouts mean brigade members are called away from their jobs less and the community don't have an extra problem in their lives, be it fire, medical and motor accident to deal with.

The highlight of the month was the 50-year celebrations for one of Leigh brigade's original members, Robbie Torkington. Robbie's wife Sharon, family members, locals, current and past brigade members and members of other fire brigades came to celebrate with him. Everyone enjoyed a good night and a get together with some past members catching up with those they served with. Fifty years is a long time and the community thanks Robbie for those years given and to Sharon for supporting him

Brigade members are working hard on training with five members getting ready for an Emergency Driver Course. Paul Smith has followed up on his first aid and first responder course and now completed a recruit fire fighter course at Auckland Training Centre. Congratulations to Paul who is now a fully operational firefighter, boosting our numbers following Bob Boyes' retirement after 10 years.

Members of the brigade attended Leigh School and went through a Firewise programme. It was great to see how knowledgeable the children were with many already knowing to "get low, get out and stay out" in the event of a house fire. Most knew about smoke detectors and not to put ashes into anything other than a metal bucket to dispose of them.

Smoke detectors really do save lives and it would be great to see every house in Leigh having at least one working smoke detector. Anyone wanting information about smoke detectors should contact any member of the brigade.
