Editorial

It looks like the long wet winter is finally over. Everyone has bemoaned the fact that the ground has been so wet, maybe the wettest most can remember. But the effects of the wet winter on the sea surrounding Leigh have also been very noticeable. Every big deluge brings a plume of orange/ brown muddy water that spreads around the coast between Pakiri and Tawharanui with concentrations at Goat Island, Leigh Harbour, Whangateau Harbour and Matheson Bay.

One effect is the loss of marine species that most people don't notice. In the early 2000s we often dived to photograph and record the species of nudibranchs and other sea slugs around Matheson Bay. I think some 33 species were recorded there whereas today there are less than 10. No one knows the effects of this loss. There are probably other species around the Leigh coast that are also disappearing. Unless someone has an interest in them or is studying them they vanish unnoticed.

Similarly along Pakiri and Te Aria beaches after storms, tons of horse mussels washed up. The smell was pretty bad after a day or two and lots of other species washed up with them. Why have they disappeared? I know it's easy to blame the sand mining that occurs on the north end of Pakiri but again we don't know.

I can remember the Bryde's whales feeding close to the Leigh coast and in Omaha Bay along with common dolphins and gannets. They too have diminished in number in recent years. Straylining at the edge of these workups usually brought in a good snapper but even these fish have dropped in number around the gulf in recent years.

I'd like to think that the changes for the worse that have happened since I first fished and snorkelled 60 years ago won't continue the downward trend over the next 60 years. The only thing that isn't decreasing is the human population and that is the reason for the decline of everything else.

With the weather warming up there are swimmers back in the water so it looks like summer is on the way. The intrepid Matheson Bay swimming group have reported that the water is a balmy 15 deg! None of them have come up against the 18 fur seals that have been reported around the coast to Goat Island. Let's hope that the smorgasbord of fish in the marine reserve isn't depleted by them too much.

The Kohuroa Stream Track upgrade group hope soon to be back in action. As the area in which they are working is ecologically sensitive, Auckland Council have undertaken a resource consent process to ensure that all aspects of the upgrade are appropriately covered to avoid any damage to or mistreatment of the bush area.

Additionally, group leader, Roger Williams, as part of Forest and Bird, has been successful in obtaining a \$3000 grant to install information signage with description and illustration for trees in Kowhai Park, Warkworth (30+) and Matheson Bay Track, and upgrade signage at the Dome Walkway and Parry Kauri Park. This should promote a better understanding of our native habitat. It will become an education facility for both young and old. Thus the Kohuroa Stream Track will benefit from having signs near some of the native plant species along the track. Kowhai Park will be completed first followed by the Kohuroa Stream Track. The track around Leigh Harbour is closed due to a large tree falling across it.

Just a wee reminder that old septic tanks may need a clean out to guard against overflow during the busy summer season. And if your guttering gets a lot of leaf litter your water tank may also need a flush out so it can fill before the holidays.

At last the ground is dry enough for working bees. We're having our first one this week,

Thursday, 19 October, 9-11 a.m. and should reach a milestone with the Coast Care project. We'll clear the last area of pest plants along the cliff top, ready for autumn planting. It is amazing to think that through huge community support we have almost achieved what we set out to do about nine years ago.

With fresh water quality so much in the news lately it is timely to reflect upon what is happening where our local streams meet the sea. The contrast between the water quality of the streams feeding in to the Leigh Harbour and the quality of other local streams is marked. It shows the difference bush on the stream edges can make in reducing sediment in the water. This is a community issue as clay and mud smother out fresh water crustaceans that were abundant in our local streams not very long ago, and are now locally extinct.

The Whangateau Harbour Care planting this weekend on the banks of a stream that is part of the Whangateau Harbour catchment is a great example of what can be achieved by community effort. The riparian work of the Leigh Harbour Valley Society and some other local land owners is also to be applauded. *Neil Sutherland*






LEIGH SCHOOL

HISTORY

Many people attended a send-off for Archie Dunning at Leigh Hall on Friday night, 19 October 1917. The next day a crowd gathered on the wharf "to bid him goodbye" as he sailed away on the *Kawau*. It had been his final leave before embarking the following month on the *Tofua* with the 32nd Reinforcements of NZ Mounted Rifles Brigade bound for Egypt.

Mr J.C. [Charlie] Wyatt had recently chaired a meeting of the newly-formed Fruitgrowers' Assn to which seven Leigh fruit growers had signed up. He then travelled to Pakiri to encourage the growers there to also join. Willie Clarke had received a letter from Johnny Greenwood serving in France. Johnny and cousins, Bert and Percy Greenwood, also in France had all received YMCA coupons worth either 5 shillings or 7s 6d from funds raised at a recent Dome Valley Entertainers' Concert. The Rodney and Otamatea Times reported that "good and helpful articles on the drink question had been read" at the recent



meeting of the Pakiri WCTU [Women's Christian Temperance Union] held at Pakiri Hall. They raised £2 3s towards the Government's purchase of minesweepers and decided to hold a social evening in early December for "the good of the cause."

Four men from the Leigh district were among the too many men who would not return from the war taking place in October in Passchendaele, Belgium: George Rogers, Willie Haskell, Cyrus Matheson and Ken Brown.

September was a quieter month than the last few for Leigh brigade members with only 6 callouts. These were power lines down at Matakana, motor vehicle accidents at Matakana and Matheson Bay and first response medicals to Ti Point, Matheson Bay and Leigh.

The longer evenings are here with daylight saving and it's a good time to check batteries in smoke alarms, Smoke alarms save lives – it's the smoke that you don't notice that kills. If you don't have a smoke detector or think yours doesn't work, contact Tony on 422 6127 or 021 167 1524.

Although we are only a small brigade a recent visit from Fire and Emergency area management told us that we are among the top brigades in the country for administration and training. It was also the chance for brigade members to ask questions such as why is the fire station building upgrade taking so long and a few other gripes although the meeting was positive. Let's see if the on-off building alterations happen within their time frame of completion by July 2018.

Another of our long-serving fire fighters, Tony Borich has moved to Warkworth and has left the brigade after 14 years.

Thanks to those members of Leigh community who helped at the fire station, made scones and offered support during the recent house fire. It's these little things that make all that we do for the community worthwhile.

I think our numbers are the lowest in quite a while but we're still managing to turn out a crew to every callout. If you think you'd like to give fire fighting a go, come down to the fire station at 7pm on Tuesday night and have a look at what we do. *Tony Enderby Brigade Secretary*

The Rodney Rams had an Open Day on 23 September 2017 to celebrate and welcome the community and supporters into their new clubrooms. Greg Whaiapu, the General Manager of Auckland Rugby League attended the opening. The official opening ribbon was cut by Caitlin Conning-Inkersole, granddaughter of recently-deceased, long standing club president

Raymond Inkersole. Sadly, 83-year-old Ray passed away less than two months before the club's opening. Ray's passing was a great loss to the club as he'd been there right throughout the rebuild (and long before) and he was very enthusiastic to see the new clubrooms re-open. Sadly, this was not to be. Following the ribbon cutting, the building was blessed by local kaumatua John Marsden.

The rebuild which began in 2015 (after the building was lost to a fire in 2014) was funded by varied sources, including insurance, Ray Inkersole's contribution of \$15,000 towards the decking, Foundation North contributed \$99,000 to complete the kitchen and the club also won a Woodstock Facebook competition in 2016 - where Woodstock requested nominations on Facebook for two NZ league clubs in need of a hand up. The Rams were lucky enough to win one of these two prizes, \$10,000 which was used to complete two toilets areas in the clubrooms.

Over the past three years there has been a lot of fundraising by members and many generous sponsors who have helped to make this new building come to fruition.

The Rodney Rams would like to convey sincere thanks to everybody who has been involved in supporting the club to rebuild and new members are very welcome.

Thursday night raffles continue to be held at 4pm and the new kitchen will be opening in the near future at a date TBA. The summer Touch module starts Friday, 20 October.
