#### **Editorial**

Over the past few weeks many Leigh and Whangateau locals have commented on the length of grass on local reserves. One that brought it to a head was the paper road between Harbour View Road and Cotterel Street in Leigh which had been ignored for months by council contractors and reached waist-high length.

Complaints to Auckland Council were responded to with what has become a standard answer "It's not our area – it is managed by Auckland Transport."

A complaint to Auckland Transport met with the same dead end, "it's Auckland Council's area not Auckland Transport."

This kind of buck passing is not acceptable. We often see up to three ride-on mowers in town, several days a week. They travel for an hour and spent a couple of hours in Leigh mowing for Auckland Council's Parks and Recreation, then a day later do the same thing for Auckland Transport. On one day we watched as all three drove in convoy from the hall to the tennis courts in Albert Street. One mowed some of the grass while the others sat on the road and watched. Then all three drove off down the road and vanished.

Auckland Council has said that they are looking at efficiency but the huge increase in staff wages and numbers over the past five years suggests otherwise.

If the wasted time and money spent in travelling to and mowing some of the grass in Leigh is anything to go by, the time wasted across all of Auckland doing the same thing must be enormous.

We have to wonder how many people are now employed by Auckland Council and Auckland Transport just to respond to complaints by passing the buck. Somewhere there must be some accountability but no one at the top of either organisation seems keen on putting their hand up.

Thanks must go to our local board member, Beth Houlbrooke, for trying to get answers. Maybe we'll finally see someone mow the paper road between Harbour View Road and Cotterell Street





#### Leigh 100 years ago

Apart from the odd shower, Leigh had enjoyed sunshine for most of April. Easter Monday on the first was a particularly fine day. Charles Clarke's son, Willie and his wife Grace drove in the sulky to Goat Island Beach where they enjoyed a picnic with the local school teacher, Mrs Knowles and her children. Willie arrived home with a schnapper [sic] and a crayfish. A few days later he had put out a net and Charles was pleased with Willie's haul of lots of piper and other fish.

It was good weather for attending to all the autumn jobs on the farm and around the house. Charles had spent many hours removing periwinkle and convolvulus from the pig paddock and from around the apple trees. Jim Wyatt, youngest brother of Eddie and the late Len Wyatt, was disc harrowing the ploughed grounds to prepare them for the manuring and drilling in of grass seeds. Willie's horse, Prince worked with Jim's team of horses.

Kumara were harvested. Fern was cut from around the stockyards and burned. Tea tree was pulled out of the ploughed fields, and also cut and burned.

Charles loved his gardens. He planted several clumps of *Golden Bell* daffodils, and one each of *Bride* and *Old Scarlet* gladioli. He posted an order for more bulbs and grass and flower seeds to Arthur Yates on the 10th; seven days later on Wednesday afternoon, they all arrived on the steamer. The next day, he planted some *Scarborough* lilies, a dozen ranunculi and two dozen anemones. In seed boxes he sowed seeds of snapdragon, canditult, and centaurea.

Grace had gone down to the wharf to collect the mail on the evening of 18th April and heard that Elliot Greenwood has been killed in action at the Western Front. Elliot had completed all his primary schooling at Little Omaha [Leigh] School. The Rodney and Otamatea Times reported "many friends and school-mates of Elliot at Leigh sympathise with his parents." He was the only son of Mr and Mrs Joseph Greenwood, orchardists in Henderson.

On 25th April, the New Zealand Herald reported that arrangements were complete for the "fitting celebration in the city today of the third anniversary of Anzac Day." Anzac veterans gathered at Queen's Wharf at 2.15pm and marched to the Town hall where three ministers of religion addressed them. In the evening a smoke concert was held in the Town Hall. One thousand guests - returned soldiers and local body representatives - were expected to attend the concert for men only - where they could also smoke. It was reported that many Anzacs had come into Auckland from the King Country, Waikato and northern districts.

By April 1918, thirty three men with connections to Omaha/Leigh had left the district for service in Samoa, the Middle East or the Western Front. Twelve would not be returning.

It was a fine day in Leigh on 25th April 1918. Charlie Wyatt finished drilling the *Western Wolts* in the middle of the morning and Willie was boarding it in. Charles Clarke planted a chrysanthemum that Mrs D. Matheson had given him - and sowed some stock seed.

## **Leigh Volunteer Fire Brigade**

March was one of the brigade's busiest months ever with 18 callouts and four callouts on the busiest day. There were motor vehicle accidents at Matakana (2) and Omaha, a car fire on Pakiri Hill, a false alarm at Matakana, a vegetation fire at Matakana, trees fallen onto road at Omaha Valley and Goat Island and medicals at Pakiri, Tomarata, Goat Island, Leigh (5), Matheson Bay and Matakana. Several of these emergencies saw the Northland Rescue and Westpac helicopters evacuate patients, in one case both helicopters were on scene.

The fire station building alterations are now in full swing with brigade members having loaded chairs, tables and other equipment into the container on the fire station forecourt. The changes will be complete by July if all goes to plan and an official opening will take place along with an open day later in the year. Access to the fire station will be restricted during the building process under health and safety regulations but the brigade will continue to attend callouts.

Training has been curtailed a little by the weather and the ever-increasing procedures and paperwork instigated by the new Fire and Emergency New Zealand regime. Our fire appliance went away for a COF and has not returned and we have a relief vehicle on station. In spite of the setbacks we will still be responding to emergencies.

Robbie Torkington, who has been a member of the brigade for more than 50 years has decided to hang up his helmet. He'll still be around helping with jobs on station. Enjoy your retirement Robbie and try not to hog the TV remote off Sharon. Thanks to you both for all those years of service and support to Leigh brigade and the community. We think you've earned Tuesday nights off.

Our firefighter numbers are down a little and we could do with a few more keen recruits. If you think you'd like to give firefighting a go, come down to the fire station at 7pm on Tuesday night and have a look at what we do.
