If there is a number on your cellphone that you don't know, don't be tempted to phone back – not all are overseas numbers and you could end up paying a huge bill as someone profits from your calling back.

New Zealanders have lost hundreds of millions of dollars over the years to scams. Sadly the people that benefit to the tune of billions of dollars from selling computer systems and hardware seem unable or unwilling to stop scams.

Don't waste valuable time trying to find local numbers to call if you need fire, ambulance, police or assistance.

Call 111 and ask for the appropriate service.

Service providers also struggle to cope with the spam emails that appear with monotonous regularity.

If you are unsure the email came from the person you think it did, then click on the little arrow alongside the sender's email address. You will soon realise if it is not right.

I've reached the stage where I treat all as possible scams and delete them. This has meant that genuine emails sometimes get ignored, especially when they have no subject line. Maybe one day the scam and spam problem will get sorted but I'm not holding my breath waiting.



With the water temperature at 18 deg, swimmers are still enjoying their dips and using the pontoon which has not been removed yet. The south side of the beach has had rocks placed to shore up the bank and stop erosion from high tides and easterly storms. New grass has been laid, but the pole with the 'dog sign' has gone west!

Matheson Bay Road upgrade is still progressing with a great new footpath and kerbing and channelling on one side. Highway Stabilisers have been busy removing old seal in parts, laying gravel, lime and new seal. Although not quite finished the road is certainly a lot smoother. Not so for Spray Crescent which has had another lot of patches to add to, or replace those done this time last year. As many of the instructions on the road (which were sprayed on last November) have faded, it is hoped that they will also be attended to. Council have been notified of resident's concerns.

Leigh 100 years ago

Sunday 5 May 1918, Charles Clarke recorded that it was "the 55th Anniversary of my leaving Gravesend, England in the ship *Queen of Beauty."* The Presbyterian minister, Reverend Gould held service in the hall in the morning. That evening Charles had dinner with Mr Gould, Ernie Greenwood and Eddie Wyatt at Mr Archie Dunning's place.

Charles was in his seventies and still working hard, and often walked to Whangateau and back. Through the autumn months, he had been cutting down the tea tree [now known as manuka]. His son Willie fashioned clothes props from them. He gathered these into bundles which he tied with flax. He hauled two bundles at a time to the wharf.

Charles "pulled and collected" the pieces of remaining teatree (sic) which were fed into the charcoal kiln which Willie fired up each month. At the end of May, the kiln had only turned out 29 sacks of charcoal as much wood had not burned. Charles sewed up the sacks. On the 6th June, the steamer took all the props and charcoal to Auckland.

Leigh Volunteer Fire Brigade

Things quietened down after a busy March with 10 callouts in April. These were motor vehicle accidents at Big Omaha, Omaha, Upper Whangateau and Warkworth, medical calls to Leigh (4), a scrub fire which turned out to be a controlled burn at Matakana and a call in error to a fire in the far north.

By now everyone must have noticed the work going on at the fire station. Walls have been ripped out, strengthening of beams, concrete being poured and a multitude of other changes taking place. Hopefully by early July the work will be finished but in the meantime, access to the fire station will be restricted under health and safety regulations.

Brigade members were happy to see the return of our fire truck from the workshops. Although it is the oldest in the area it is reliable and small enough to fit up some tight driveways. This is a bit of a problem as the wet summer produced great growth in trees and other vegetation. If your driveway is a bit overhung with trees have a go at trimming them or give one of the contractors in the Leigh Rag a call to help. In some areas houses which should have been saved have been lost to fires when the local brigade could not get their truck close enough quickly.

Everyone should have working smoke alarms and their chimneys swept for winter. If you need help with checking smoke alarms give one of our members a call. These devices really do save lives as anyone who watched the TV1 controlled house fire on Seven Sharp a few weeks ago would know.

We could do with a few more keen recruits who could train up to become firefighters. If you think you'd like to give firefighting a go, come down to the fire station at 7pm on Tuesday night and have a look at what we do.
