

Forest and Bird COMMUNITY COAST CARE GROUP, Leigh

An interesting couple of weeks for our group. Last week we had a very productive working bee with a good turn out. If you walk the Leigh Harbour track you might notice a lot of dead morning glory, and fewer seedling pines and gorse bushes along the track. This is another area where our planting from about four vears ago is really taking off.

Also last week a couple of senior managers from Auckland Council were brought out to see our project, partly because it is long running (almost ten years) and partly because the project is moving from pest plant removal into pest animal removal - in conjunction with the Korora/Little Blue Penguin project. They gave very positive feedback and offers of support.

When we did our latest weekly check of our Leigh coastal trapline we got a catch rate of six from eleven traps! They're out there! Now is the time when rodents are looking for winter hideouts, so any help Leigh householders can give by having traps on their properties will help everyone. We'd love to have your Neil Sutherland support.

Pest Free Leigh Woolly Nightshade/Tobacco Weed

This plant produces toxins that poison the soil and inhibit regeneration. It spreads rapidly and can grow up to ten metres tall. The grey-green leaves are covered in dusty hairs and the stem is whitish and soft. When in flower there are clusters of purple flowers 15-20mm in diameter, followed by round yellowish berries. Seeds are spread by birds, especially native pigeon (kererū). Around Leigh there are plenty of woolly nightshade trees growing and it is another nasty plant that would be good to get rid of.



Pull up any small plants and leave to rot. This is easiest

during winter months. Larger trees should be cut off and have poison applied to the stumps. To help stop it from returning cut any stems that re-sprout.

ANZAC DAY



World War One ended in November 1918 and peace was celebrated between 19 and 21 July 1919. There was no official day to commemorate the war and the New Zealand Government suggested moving St George's Day to 25 April and to declare the day a public holiday. There was very little support for this but having an Anzac Day appealed to the public.

In 1920 the government, in response to the Returned Services' Association (RSA) request, declared a holiday with the first to be

held on 25 April 1921. Legislation at first closed banks, hotels and banned race meetings, but the RSA wanted the holiday to be like a Sunday. Anzac Day became a full public holiday in 1922 and evolved during the 1920s and 1930s. Many public war memorials were erected in provincial towns around New Zealand and Anzac Day ceremonies held there. The ceremonies became less religious and RSA leaders, local politicians and servicemen made speeches instead of the clergy.

Ceremonies began to include laying wreaths and dawn parades commemorated the first landings at Gallipoli by New Zealand and Australian troops.

After the Second World War, Anzac Day became a commemoration of all wars in which New Zealanders had served. Veterans from both world wars paraded together and attendance at Anzac Day services increased.

Legislation protected Anzac Day from becoming 'Mondayised', meaning that Anzac Day would always be held on 25 April. Some services were moved from dawn to midmorning or extra services were added.

Now many younger New Zealanders proudly wear the medals their grandparents and great grandparents won during the wars. There are no longer any veterans left from Gallipoli or WWI and veterans from WWII, Korea and Vietnam become less each year.

Leigh's Anzac Day parade often has numbers greater than the population of the town with large numbers of children present. What better way to remember those who fought for our freedom in wars past and to ensure that our way of life is preserved.

The actions of some officials in Auckland in closing Anzac Services this year are far removed from what our forebears went away and fought for. If common sense prevails Anzac Day will return to all the venues where it was previously celebrated.

Omaha Cove (Leigh Harbour) Walk Closed 16-30 April

DOC will be working with a contractor to undertake track construction works to prevent the spread of kauri dieback by people on tracks. The work will occur on two tracks: Omaha Cove Walk and Beverley Price Loop Track.

The construction work will include improving drainage, reshaping and resurfacing tracks, building boxed steps, a staircase and boardwalk. These tracks will be temporarily closed during the works to ensure soil hygiene and safety to the public and contractors.

The Beverley Price Loop (Warkworth) will be closed from 16 April 2019 to 28 i June 2019.
