Shopping Update for Over 70's and families with immune deficiency:

The supermarkets have been hard hit and while reacting well to the increased demand and health safety measures access is slow -

a normal shop with queueing time can be up to 2 to 3 hrs.

Online shopping is completely overloaded with it almost impossible to place a click and collect order or a delivery. Small Shops:

Shopping can be done at Matakana 4 square and Omaha Superette both shops are well supplied and well organised. The Matakana Pharmacy, Matakana Butchery and the Matakana 4 Square will deliver to the Leigh area, some restrictions of age or health issues may apply for delivery

Care Mongers based in Warkworth supported by Lions & Rotary is and online Volunteer Group who will do shopping on Tuesday and Thursday

### Leigh Hall

As everyone is aware we are unable to use the hall during lockdown. We ask that if anyone notices any unusual activity or any problem to contact us. We are still hopeful that the planned upgrade will happen shortly after lockdown is lifted.

Water is still a major issue – yes, you can still get 30 litres per person per day from the emergency water supply at the Cumberland Street side of the hall. Please use safe handling practices to avoid the spread of Covid19, i.e. hand washing or sanitising, using your own clean containers, - and leave the area clean and tidy. We have been told that this supply will continue until the drought is properly broken. Most water suppliers still have a waiting list, but if you are totally out of water try phoning your usual supplier and ask if they could do an urgent fill for you. Always check pricing and wait list times before booking a refill as these vary. Some suppliers are travelling long distances to get to us. We understand that

Rhodes and Masons have the shortest lists at the moment. Thank you to all the water delivery firms we couldn't get through without you. Don't forget to save your aluminium cans for us - the two can cages in Cumberland Street give the hall a small boost to our fundraising efforts. Aluminium cans only (no glass or plastic or rubbish) and take vour boxes containers away afterwards, thanks. Bookings and enquiries to

Well what a month we trust you have all settled into your bubble well and are adjusting to the lockdown lifestyle. As it has for all of us the world has changed for the Leigh community Club committee and members

Monthly Club meetings are postponed indefinitely

Anzac Day Celebrations have been cancelled by the government along with all other outside events

The Club has focused on all things COVID19 and ensuring our Leigh community is well informed of the wider Mahurangi help facilities and how to access food supplies and health networks. Checking that residents are being supported in their lockdown residence of choice.

As movement has been severely restricted as has printing, communications channel has been via social media; namely LoveLeigh Facebook Group and Leigh Community Group Pages to pull together relevant, council, government and local community news that helps our village keep informed on health and safety, what's open and what's not and how to source critical supplies.

As a community group we have also linked into our neighbourhood groups in Pakiri, Matheson Bay, Whangateau, Ti Point, Matakana, Warkworth and Omaha. These groups have been a fantastic source of helpful local information and also getting problems addressed that were common to us all.

We are lucky in Leigh to still have our Local Store open 4 hours 7 days a week as in the new normal world sourcing food has been a major issue with queues at supermarkets and the overloading of online ordering.

Over 70's have been particularly restricted as have families with health concerns. Neighbours and the Warkworth Caremongers group have been fantastic to ensure people food needs are being looked after

On top of these Covid-19 issues are water shortage or "the Big Dry" continues The tap stand water organised with Council at Leigh Hall has been a godsend and even at time of writing is being well used. Rain is starting to fall and decent rain should soon be upon us. We still need rain (In April who would have thought) Overall the people in our local area are supporting each other well and following the lockdown however the stresses are only going to mount as people try and survive on minimum incomes and one off expenses start to hit.

We know this is only just the beginning of what will be a long process of community restrictions until a vaccine is widely available. It looks like NZ is well positioned to minimize deaths but getting the economy going is a massive challenge particularly for an area like ours where tourism is a key factor.

The Leigh Community Club will continue to work to ensure that the great community spirit this area is known for continues throughout this long recovery.

Remembrance of Matheson Bay holiday resident Christine Peake Sadly, we record the death of Christine Peak QSM on Wednesday March 25th 2020.

Christine and husband Brian have been holiday residents at Matheson Bay for many years. In the late 1940s, Christine's parents Roy and Doreen Harris from New Plymouth used to holiday in February at Leigh, staying at Botterill's house near Leigh Harbour. Christine was a pupil at Leigh School for a few weeks each year while her dad went fishing.

Years later, in 1967. Christine married Brian Peak from Epsom Auckland. They lived and worked in London for a few years and, upon returning to settle in the Takapuna area, had a holiday cottage built at Matheson Bay in early 1970s. This was a much used holiday residence for Christine, Brian and family friends for 30 yrs.

In 2004 the original cottage was moved off site and Peter Wyatt built a more substantial home for them.—the brown house halfway down Grandview Rd with the flag on top.

Christine has enjoyed many happy times at Matheson Bay— always active with boating fishing adventures, swimming, walking and generally being a loving and generous wife, mother, grandmother, and friend to many.

She was a highly respected musician. Pianist, violinist, orchestral and choral conductor, and much respected music teacher. She taught at Kristin School, Diocesan School, Kings College, Carmel College and Westlake Girls High School.

On Wednesday 25th March, she died peacefully at Harbour Hospice North Shore after a period of ill health born with courage and stoicism.

Christine will be greatly missed by her family and wide circle of friends gathered from her lifetime of selfless giving, and inspiring others.

Matheson Bay will not be the same again without her. We treasure our happy memories of this special lady. "

Since our last report in the March Leigh Rag, Auckland City Council has advised that we were awarded a grant of \$13,100 for two years - \$26,200 – towards co-ordination for Predator Free Leigh. This is a great start for our project but not nearly enough to undertake the landscape wide project we had originally planned.

The Auckland Council, however, did provide a letter of support for our application to DOC for

co-ordination funding. Applications for this fund closed just before lock-down. Like everything else, decisions regarding this process have been suspended.

In the meantime, we encourage you all to continue your own trapping and predator control initiatives. With the colder weather starting, the rodents and mustelids will be searching for food. We can restrict infestations through our

own vigilance.

### **Leigh Penguin Project**

To protect penguins and other native flora and fauna we have set out traplines to reduce introduced mammalian predators. We are not using any poison but use non-toxic baits like peanut butter, eggs and rabbit meat. The Rodney Local Board and the DoC Community Fund have helped us to set up these traplines. Many thanks also to Arthur Gundy for making so many trap boxes and Jackie Atkins for providing eggs. Also many other locals have donated material for trapboxes, traps and volunteered to check traplines regularly. Thanks to these efforts, we are reducing the numbers of predators.

The Leigh Coast trapline was started in February 2019 and recently had more traps added with two more local volunteers helping out. More than 70 rats, mice and weasels have been caught. The Ti Point Walkway trapline was set up in May 2019 and now over 120 possums, rats, stoats, weasels and mice have been caught. Around Leigh Harbour, we set up traps along the coastal walkway and up through the bush. Within the first week or so we had caught our first stoat and rat. Generally not a lot is being caught there which is a sign there are not many predators, although seven rats were caught in one check.

Our next trapline was recently created at the end of Ti Point and partly into the Ti Point Reserve. The first time checked there were 5 rats and 2 weasels, so a good start. This was followed with several stoats, another weasel and more rats. We are looking for volunteers to check this trapline once a month.

With over 250 predators removed from these areas, it must be good news for our flora and fauna. We must not forget that we are doing this to help our native birds, insects, lizards and trees and we are seeing an increase in their numbers.

# **Leigh Volunteer Fire Brigade**

Leigh Fire Brigade is having to change the way everything is done, due to Covid-19. All callouts have to be treated as a possible virus contamination. Some of our members are unable to attend so we are relying on a smaller number on callouts. On the plus side, at the time of writing there have been no callouts involving Covid-19. Hopefully this will continue.

March was a very busy month with 15 callouts, easily the busiest March on record. These were a vegetation fire, illegally lit at Ti Point, a shed on fire at Ti Point, smoke showing at Pakiri, false alarms at Goat Island and Matakana and 10 first response medical calls. These were to Leigh (5), Whangateau (4) and Ti Point.

It's great to see almost everyone sticking to the lockdown rules. The confusion over whether we could swim or not caused a few issues. Sadly a few abused the rules which hopefully will not lead to a Covid-19 problem at Leigh. The important thing is to ensure you wash your hands thoroughly with soap for 20 seconds and avoid touching your face and keep the 2-metre self-isolating distance outside your bubble.

Remember all outdoor fires are totally banned for the duration of the lockdown. Our team don't want to have to deal with any unnecessary callouts which may expose them to coronavirus. If we do get callouts, expect to see the team in protective clothing, which is for their protection. This does not mean that the callout is in any way related to Covid-19.

All our training has been put on hold until further notice and weekly checks of trucks and equipment is carried out by a small duty crew to minimise any exposure.

Stay safe out there and stick to the rules so our area remains free of this disease and we can return to normal as soon as possible.

We're digging through the vault, uploading and releasing new videos from past concerts every week. Right now, we are uploading the 2017 concert from Australian bluegrass band The Company. It's certainly a show worth re-watching!

When we reopen, all the usual regular activities will resume. Narcotics Anonymous provide Addiction Support meetings every Thursday evening. The flax weaving group meets on Wednesdays. If you're interested in learning to weave flax, the Hetete School is offering a free online introductory lesson that will take you through selecting, harvesting and preparing flax through making your first project, a kono. Go to <a href="https://example.com/heteschoolofmaoriart.com">heteschoolofmaoriart.com</a> to sign up for your free lesson, and maybe by the end of this lockdown you'll be looking to join the other weavers in our community!

Music will also at the hall once we reopen. We've had to postpone performances from Bluegrass & Beyond, The Slow Water Band, and Diane Ponzio, so we will be rescheduling them and many others once it is safe again for us all to gather together at the hall.

Auckland Council was scheduled to begin renewal repairs to the hall in May. It is unclear how the shut down will affect that, but we will keep everyone informed.
