LEIGH COMMUNITY CLUB update

Winter is now truly upon us. The nights have closed in, we have had our first storms and the shortest day is just around the corner.

While winter means hibernation in many parts of the world, in our little bit of paradise winter is a busy time for the Leigh Community Club. It is when we get most of our plans put into action as members are looking for activities to keep them busy and involved.

Our Pest Free Leigh and Waste Free Leigh members are out and about supporting The Mid-Winter Swim and the Snugleigh Projects.

Keep an eye out for the Mid-Winter Lights in Leigh as part of the Mahurangi Winter Festival of Lights in mid-July.

On the Council Liaison front we are delighted to advise that after many years of lobbying, the Rodney Board has confirmed that the footpath extension to Leigh Sawmill Café is approved for this year's capital budget with a start date yet to be advised. This is great news as it means walking to and from the Sawmill can be a safe family experience and is another step in keeping our community well connected.

Our main fund raiser this year is to help get a safe public pre school play area in Leigh on some of the available Council Land. This is likely to be a multi-year project but hopefully a lot shorter than getting the footpath extension through council.

Our Leigh 100 Raffle is the main fund raiser for this cause and while we have had great support thus far, tickets are still available.

DEST FREE LEIGH

We are now six-months into our project, aimed at creating a safe haven for wildlife in the Leigh environs. We have started by working towards reducing the number of rats. Collectively we have now caught more than 244 rats and 148 mice over six months. Of these, 100 rats were caught in the month of April alone! That is a great effort from all the team.

Our initial goal was to get rat traps into the backyards of Leigh, Matheson Bay and Ti Point residents. Over 200 trappers have picked up the challenge and are monitoring a rat trap, however there is still more work to do. We plan to expand our efforts soon, by adding in more rat traps and different types of traps to target possums and mustelids (stoats and weasels).

Although looking after one rat trap may feel like a small contribution, each person that has a rat trap is supporting our Pest Free Leigh objectives. Our collective efforts contribute to larger, 'landscape-scale' projects such as the work of The Forest Bridge Trust, and this in turn contributes to our nation-wide 'Predator Free 2050' goals. The recent series "Fight for the Wild" (TV programme and podcast) highlighted the groundswell of effort New Zealanders are making towards achieving predator-free status. Plastic Free July

Some tips to help you reduce your plastics to help you prepare for Plastic Free July!

- Get your reusable items out! Reusable coffee cups, drink bottles, shopping bags, containers for meat, bags for bread, cutlery, take away containers; anything can get access without the packaging.
- Bakeries for your bread! That way you don't get bread in the plastic bags. There are really easy bread recipes available online, you can bake a few at a time and freeze the rest.
- Butchery for your meat! Go to any store with a butchery, bring your own container for your meat.
- Bin inn! Stock up on all your bulk items at bin inn with containers you have already; jars, bottles etc. Or start saving them up!
- Swap out packaged items where you can for easy to make alternatives; like crackers, hummus, bread, pizza bases, yogurt, milk, you name it. Check online for recipes.
- Swap out plastic bottles for boxes, glass or cans where you can. There are lots of alternatives for juices, laundry detergents, and milks now!
- Say no to packaged fruits and veggies, frozen or fresh- you can prep your own veggies and freeze them or shop at places like the Matakana Market where you can get fresh produce without the packaging. Or swap with your locals for fresh veg and fruit that they probably have!
- Swap out your cleaning products for easy DIY ones that you can store in your empty cleaning containers (like old spray bottles) these often are much better for you too. Heaps of recipes online.
- Swap out the unnatural fibres for natural fibres- unnatural fibres are often in sponges or scrub brushes, check out natural alternatives, like cotton cleaning cloths or coconut husk scrubbers.
- Check the labels! Some facial scrubs and other personal care products contain tiny plastic beads- avoid anything with "polyethylene" listed as an ingredient. Try out some natural hygiene products like deodorants which usually come in paper or tins!
- Second hand stores! These places are a treasure trove of goodies, and this way you are giving items a second life.

There are so many options and alternatives to list, but the best thing you can do is to research what you can and see what fits best for you and your life style. This is to encourage you to see what you can change, and it's the little steps that count!

MATHESON BATTNEWS

Well, almost halfway through the year, how did that happen so fast. Watching the night sky when I take my dog out for last toilets, it is fascinating seeing the Southern Cross make its way from East to West. The 'Blood Moon' was particularly interesting to see and we were lucky that it was a clear night. There have been some beautiful harvest moons coming up over the sea too.

The re-sealing of the southern carpark is underway with the road closed to traffic, but with pedestrian access. They have widened the turn around which will be a help and it is hoped that the parking and yellow lines are replaced once the sealing is done, which probably won't be this week due to the rain. On the day that the works started a group of Leigh school pupils planted 400 various natives along the riverbank side of the reserve. This will help the wet area that has developed. A **Community Planting Day on the 3rd July at 9.00am**, will be held to add to the planting already done over the past two years. The plants are doing well and the next 1250 to be planted will make a serious difference to the ecology of the area over time. Once the smaller plants have established, larger trees will be able to thrive there too. Planters to bring a spade, gloves, boots, water and wear old clothes.

Group 3 vaccinations underway If you're over 65 and live in the Auckland or Northland regions, you'll receive your invitation to book a COVID-19 vaccination by Friday, 18 June. All invitations to Group 3, including people with underlying health conditions, will be issued by mid-July. You'll receive a text or an email from NMF Immunisation bookings inviting you to book your appointment. If you belong to a GP clinic that is also offering COVID-19 vaccinations, you may also receive an invitation from them too. You can click on the link in the text or email to make your appointment. The invitations are issued automatically by text or email, so you don't need to do anything until you receive yours.

LITTLE BLUE PENGUINS - KORORĀ

You can hear the buzz of citizen science in Leigh these days. Talk to most locals and before long you're discussing the success of a new rat bait or which 'poo' is best for the compost or what to do to control the guava

moth. We're all gathering ideas- doing a bit of science in our own back yard.

It's the same with the Kororā project. We're citizens who are learning, trying, analyzing, as we develop our practices for bird monitoring and creating a safer environment for our local kororā population. Which is the best place for a penguin box? What can we learn from where they choose to build natural nests? Is there a trend in what they use for nesting material? Is there a time pattern to when they arrive or leave their nest each night? Why have some returned now when it seems too early for nesting? We're constantly recording information in the hope that with time, patterns will emerge from which we'll learn more about our little blue friends.

Through our project we have learnt so much, but increasingly realize we know so little. One thing we recognise, though, is how great it is to live surrounded by a world of natural things waiting to be discovered. We just need to keep our noses, ears and eyes open to the opportunities. It's a bit like living in a giant natural laboratory sometimes!!

Forest and Bird COAST CARE GROUP, Leigh.

The community response to our removal of pest plants from the village's coastal areas has been amazing. Two weeks ago we had thirteen at our working bee in the Kowhai Tce bush, getting it ready to plant. On Saturday fifteen came to our "planting bee" and although we covered a huge area, 350 plants and an hour and a half later we were done and feasted and on our way home! We use only native species that grow naturally in the Leigh area and planted the area where we'd removed huge amounts of jasmine, wandering Willie (tradescantia) and some acmena trees. We also wanted to plant to get shade back on the stream where some large fish perished in the heat last summer.

This week a small group will do some additional planting at the harbour end of Kowhai Tce, and another group will plant the area beyond the cemetery which has not regenerated since the fire there a couple of years ago.

Thanks to Auckland Council for the plant supply and to Whangai Trust who grew such quality plants for us. We'll hang up our spades for a while now and let winter do its thing. It's been a highly productive season. Thanks all.
