Rodney Local Board NOTICE

Lawrie Road Community Recycling Centre to temporarily close for redevelopment: With support from central government, Auckland Council is undertaking a \$2.4m redevelopment of the Lawrie Road Community Recycling Centre. When Auckland moves to Level 3, the site will remain closed for three working days to prepare to operate under Level 3 restrictions. It will then open for six days from 8:30am - 4pm for rubbish, green waste and scrap metal drop off, before closing for approximately six weeks. While the Lawrie Road site is closed, the Rustybrook Road Community Recycling Centre, 141 Rustybrook Road, Wellsford, will be open from 10am - 2pm Tuesday - Sunday. Thank you for your patience while we undertake these important improvements.

The Trust's job is to connect with community groups, agencies, iwi, families and individuals and give them support, advice and encouragement to help restore our unique native species.

LEIGH COMMUNITY PATROL LCP

Kia ora. Since our August meeting we have had 34 local people sign up and become members of this group.

Each person has gone through a police check and are currently working through 10 easy online training modules to learn about the responsibilities of being a patroller and being part of the Leigh Community Patrol Group.

We have affiliated with Community Patrols of NZ and we are setting up a Trust so we can operate and fund a successful community patrol group. We have a small group of members working on fundraising ideas and how we will fund this operation. We have a local and very visible building to set up as our base and we will require some helpful people to make it usable.

Unfortunately, due to lockdown we are limited in what we can do to keep progressing. However with the online learning happening very quickly as everyone seems to have spare time on their hands at the moment, we expect to be in a position to get things rolling as soon as we can get back to level 2.

When we are able, we will hold our first meeting as LCP and hopefully by then we will have a vehicle and be doing some hands on training with the aim to start some patrolling as summer kicks in. As well as operating a night and day type of visual patrol to deter minor crime within the Whangateau to Pakiri areas, we intend to set up a community support group depending on local needs, working in with other fantastic local community groups, as well as an emergency response type group that has the ability, knowledge and available equipment to support our community and people in times of need. Forest and Bird COAST CARE GROUP, Leigh.

With no activity for our group at the moment it is a good time to ponder and celebrate the links between Leigh community initiatives and the environment. Leigh Harbour Valley Society and the Coast Care Group are hugely indebted to the amazing work of the household trappers and street coordinators of Pest Free Leigh. From recent observations they are having a very positive effect on coastal bird populations and skink/gecko populations etc. We have a very active community waste free and recycling group, we have composting workshops, and even stream water quality testers, all contributing to rubbish reduction and improved stream water quality. As well the Whangateau Harbour Care works tirelessly to protect every aspect of our largest local harbour, the Matheson Bay community works to restore their bush and eliminate predators, the Ti Point and Pakiri communities extend their pest control work and the Forest and Bird Kororā Project monitor our local Little Penguin population.

On the education front we are lucky to have Leigh School making an exceptionally strong and ongoing commitment to environmental education and sustainability, both through their learning programme and their practical food production work. Our preschool children also have a strong environmental exposure, and at the other end the Leigh Lab undertakes that invaluable big picture world-reaching oceanic research, right here in our front yard!

Leigh Community Club is an outstanding support for our community environmental projects, both practically and financially and all this work comes down to individuals. The Club committee, the people who turn up to the composting workshops or the planting bees, the walkers who keep their dogs on a lead in the penguin territory, the house-holders who keep cats indoor at night, the teachers, the group conveners, the person who pulls out the mothplant or agapanthus or pampas.

Leigh is a unique physical environment, but it's also pretty unique to live in a village and district so committed to protecting the wonderful place that we have. In this funny old world right now, what a great thing to feel good about!!

Weeds are smothering our native plants and destroying our native landscapes.

Weed Trees and shrubs (woody plants)

Weeds that are trees or shrubs grow over or replace other plants.

Weed trees include holly, tree privet, sycamore, wattles, willows, and wilding pines. Examples of weed shrubs are barberry, boneseed, broom, buddleia, cotoneaster, gorse, heather and privet.

Weed Herbs (non-woody plants)

Herbs or perennials are non-woody plants. They can grover over small plants, crowding and preventing the regeneration of native seedlings.

Examples include Chilean rhubarb, montbretia, Mexican daisy, pampas, purple loose-strife and wild ginger

Weeds can grow in aquatic habitats, eg oxygen weed that grows in lakes.

Weed Vines

Vines climb and scramble, smothering trees and forest canopies.

Examples include banana passionfruit, bomarea, Chilean flame creeper, climbing spindleberry, ivy, Japanese honeysuckle, old man's beard, mothplant and wonga wonga vine.

Lockdown in Leigh Covid 19 Review 2020-21

Somewhat sadly I find myself writing the Leigh Community Club monthly update for the Leigh Rag during a Covid19 level 4 lockdown. Hopefully with Vaccinations in full swing this will be the last Level 4 Lockdown needed. If it is, then the Leigh Rag September edition will capture the spirit of lockdown and will become an important historic archive to be filed in Warkworth Museum and in family cupboards to show our Leigh children what the community was like when they spent their formative years Locked Down in Leigh

Covid 19 Timeline (Source wikipedia)

On 28 February 2020, New Zealand confirmed its first case, a woman in her 60s

On 29 March 2020, New Zealand also reported its first coronavirus-related death, a woman in her 70s

On 21 March, 2020 the Government introduced a four-tier alert level system, which placed much of the country's population and economy into lockdown from 25 March.

By 31 July 2020, there were 20 active cases (all resulting from overseas travel) following 102 days of no community transmissions

On 4 September 2020, after 98 days with no deaths, the country's 23rd death from COVID-19

On 25 January 2021, New Zealand identified its first community spread case of COVID-19 since November 2020

By 31 March 2021 there were 72 active cases in managed isolation, bringing the total number to 2,497

On 17 August 2021 the Ministry of Health announced one new community case of COVID-19 in Auckland. The Government moved the country into Alert Level 4 effective 11.59pm 17 August 2021

Today the 15/09/21 Leigh is still in Lockdown. The govt forecasts a possibility of level 3 for Auckland Tuesday the 21/09/21

How did Leigh and its families and volunteer community respond.

LITTLE BLUE PENGUINS - KORORĀ

Bird monitoring has been almost nonexistent during Level 4 lockdown, but yeah, we do know that we have our first chick for the 2021 season - a gorgeous ball of charcoal fluff, warmly snuggled by its parent, very active and very vocal! We're aware

of at least nine active nests, so eagerly await the time when we can get back to proper and regular monitoring.

Our group works with the NZ Penguin Initiative, a national body which coordinates penguin research, and our data is available to them. Being bound by the Wildlife Act, we are not allowed to physically interact with the birds without specific training. In fact only two of us are designated to open the penguin boxes. So what do we monitor? We look for signs that birds are using a site and also use trail cameras and burrow scopes to record the presence and movements of birds so we can keep an eye on their activity. As with last year, the birds mainly prefer natural nest sites, and these are extremely difficult to find and usually in very inaccessible places. But looking for them requires clambering around our glorious coast and keeps us fit, so we don't complain.

Our project extends around the coast from Ti Pt to Te Hawere-a-Māki / Goat Island. An initial grant from the Leigh Community Club got us going and we have ongoing support from DOC and Auckland Council. The project is a Forest and Bird Mid North Branch initiative.

Leigh Volunteer Fire Brigade

The brigade has had a relatively busy month of incidents even though the region has been as Alert Level 4 for almost half of it. There were a total of 9 incidents with false alarms in Whangateau and Pakiri, a car fire in Pakiri, traffic control for downed power lines in Leigh, and five medical responses all in Leigh.

A big thankyou to our community for staying safe, healthy and doing the right things during this Level 4 lockdown as it minimises our response call numbers and the contact our members have with any potential COVID contacts.

We are the same as everyone else and have to stay in our family bubbles but we also need to stay available for emergency callouts, so we have split into two response team bubbles, rotating weekly so if we did get contaminated then we won't have to step all of the brigade down to isolate at once.

This is a big issue for us obviously and that is why you will see us responding in full PPE including our medical responders wearing protective gowns, masks, gloves and goggles.

Please remember that you only come to the fire station to use the emergency siren activation switch between the engine bay door in a **LIFE**

THREATENING situation when you are not getting the response you want from the 111 call centre. Always call 111 first and it is up to them to call us to respond in a medical emergency if they see fit.

Daylight savings is coming up on 26th September. This is a great time to test and change the batteries in all of your smoke alarms to ensure everything is working correctly.

THIS MONTH'S WINTER FIRE SAFETY MESSAGE

Did you know that 1 in 4 house fires start in the kitchen? Here are a few tips to reduce the risk of a fire starting in the kitchen:

- Don't drink and fry Alcohol is involved in half of all fatal fires
- Don't leave the room while cooking - nnattended cooking is the leading cause of house fires
- Keep a clean and safe kitchen this prevents flammable fat and grease from building up, especially around your stove
- Keep a fire extinguisher in or close to your kitchen and make sure you know how to use it

COVID-19 symptoms

Common symptoms of COVID-19 are like those found with illnesses such as a cold or influenza. You may have one or more of the following:

new or worsening cough sneezing and runny nose fever (at least 38°C) temporary loss of smell or altered sense of taste sore throat shortness of breath

Less common symptoms of COVID-19 may include

diarrhoea,
headache, muscle aches,
nausea, vomiting,
malaise,
chest pain, abdominal pain,
joint pain
confusion/irritability.

These almost always occur with one or more of the common symptoms. Symptoms tend to arise around two to five days after a person has been infected but can take up to 14 days to show. The virus can be passed onto others before they know they have it – from up to two days before symptoms develop.
