Through sheer determination he has progressed from being dropped off to the pontoon by kayak, to reaching it by boogie board, swimming to it with the assistance of a life jacket, to now swimming out completely unaided. Toby is 14 years old and attends Marcellin College in Mount Albert

Initially, he went out to the pontoon by kayak with his Dad, and I would swim out and wait in the water. Now he can swim out by himself, either on his boogie board, or using his big arms. He swims for Howick Pakuranga Special Olympic Team and has ribbons for the 25 metres freestyle and 25 metres back stroke, as well as in the 4x 25 metre relay.

COASTAL RESTORATION GROUP

With three groups active in the community, ours, the restoration group planting at Matheson Bay, and Leigh Harbour Valley Society (LHVS), all bases are covered. There is strength in numbers, collectively we are making a huge difference. While each group has defined focus areas, they sometimes overlap. Leigh Harbour is a good example, where our group does work alongside the LHVS. We operate cooperatively, with each group appreciating the support of the other. We are thrilled to learn that the Rodney Local Board is committed to pest control, valuing the importance of protecting local flora and fauna. Their 2024 budget includes education for responsible cat ownership, working with the SPCA on a *Snip n Chip* campaign (a program that helps fund pet de-sexing to reduce the number of unwanted animals in NZ, go to https://snipnchip.spca.nz/ to apply). In collaboration with **The Forest Bridge Trust**, Rodney Local Board will also be increasing possum removal efforts in some key ecological areas. Their initiative is making meaningful improvements to our environment.

Tamahunga & Leigh Possum Control - Engagement with Community Partners

Kia ora Tamahunga Trappers, Pest Free Leigh, Leigh Harbour Valley Society, The Forest Bridge Trust and Restore Rodney East. As community partners, we value your conservation mahi, your knowledge of local species and ecosystems, and the relationships you hold with landowners. We are seeking your support to help us engage with communities and landowners about Auckland Council's regional possum control project, which is planned to be undertaken at Tamahunga and Leigh early next year. Below, we describe key information about the project and control sites planned for the next six months. Our intention is that you understand the project and have time to consider any risks or concerns. We invite you to please provide us with any feedback or questions.

What is the regional possum project?

This project is part of Auckland Council's *Long Term Plan* objective to achieve sustained control of possums on over 50% of rural land (in Auckland by 2028, enabled by the Natural Environment Targeted Rate). The project covers the entire Auckland Region and annual sites are selected based on the following considerations:

- Areas of high ecological value (both in native habitat and native species composition) that are threatened by the browsing effects of possums.
- It forms part of a contiguous landscape of possum control in line with the Regional Pest Management Plan objective, to progressively contain possums within Tāmaki Makaurau /Auckland.

Operational areas in eastern Rodney this year:

TAMAHUNGA AND LEIGH: 6,200 hectares (Contractor: Feracon Limited) — see map next page

When: from Jan 2024, control works will run for approx. 2-4 months at each site

What:

- Letters will be sent to all landowners within the control areas prior to work starting. Letters will identify the dates of possum control work, control methodology, information on how to keep pets safe during these works, contact details of the possum control contractor, and an indicative map of the control area.
- Possum control contractors will contact landowners directly to request land access permission, discuss any concerns, consider methods appropriate to that property, and organise property access.
- The possum control will be delivered by contractors using ground-based methods only bait stations or traps. The method of control will be determined by the agreement between the landowner and possum contractor on a case-by-case basis.
- The objective of these works is to reduce possum numbers to three per cent Residual Trap Catch (RTC), which is a measure of relative abundance, and to achieve sustained control of possums in the areas for at least a three-year period.
- Following the control works, possum population monitoring will be undertaken by a second independent contractor to ensure the control targets have been met (three per cent RTC).
- Local iwi have also been informed of these works as well as Local Board members. If you have any questions or concerns, or would like to discuss this project further, please let me know and I can connect you with the project manager and contractors. We hope that from this you will have a sound understanding of the possum control programme, that you can consider it within your group projects and also support local landowners if they come to you.

We are grateful for your ongoing collaboration and look forward to your valued support and input on this project.



THE LEIGH COMMUNITY PATROL

The Patrol has been busy day and night looking after the community this month. Longer days and more settled weather allows us to extend patrolling periods. Our goal is to quickly assist the public in the event of an emergency.

To this end a refresher course on first responder training was held in the Community Patrol headquarters, attended by a large group of Patrollers. Also taking the session were experienced first responders from the **Leigh Volunteer Fire Brigade**. The training focused on first-response procedures, particularly when we first encounter an unconscious driver after a motor vehicle accident. We learned that it is imperative to isolate the scene to prevent further danger. This involves activating our emergency lights, using the patrol vehicle and road cones as blockades, calling emergency services for further assistance, checking the health of the occupant (and possibly other occupants either in the vehicle or surrounding the scene) and administering first aid.

Most were able to build on skills acquired from taking St. John's first aid course. A mannequin was provided by the Leigh Fire Brigade for Patrollers to renew their CPR (Cardiac Pulmonary Resuscitation) and Automated External Defibrillator (AED) skills. An AED defibrillator is always in the patrol vehicle ready for use if required. It is used to help patients who have experienced a sudden cardiac arrest. This sophisticated yet easy to use medical device can analyze the heart's rhythm and if necessary, deliver an electric shock (or defibrillation) to help the heart re-establish an effective rhythm. Patrollers all agreed this training program was just what they needed to ensure they can ably assist during an emergency.

PEST FREE LEIGH



We are privileged to live on the Hauraki Gulf, a global seabird hotspot. Seabirds are critical to marine and terrestrial ecosystems. One of the local sounds of summer, tītī Cook's petrels can be heard at night, as they cross from the feeding grounds in the Tasman Sea to breeding sites on Hauturu Little Barrier and Aotea Great Barrier Island, via the North Auckland Seabird Flyway. (Listen for the bleating sound kekkek-kek). After the removal of introduced predators (feral cats 1980, kiore rats 2004), Cook's petrels breeding rates increased from 5% to 60% on Hauturu.

Seabirds once nested all over the North Island but introduced predators have made it very difficult for burrow-nesting birds to thrive. With pest control, some mainland areas (e.g., Tāwharanui) are seeing the return of breeding pairs such as ōi grey-faced petrels. With continued eradication efforts, we will see more seabirds nesting on our shores.

Our next **Open Day is this coming Saturday 18 November**, from 10 **am until midday, at Leigh Hall** (Cumberland St end). Traps are available for local residents. Drop in and have a chat to our team about trapping in your backyard.

- ⇒ mulch gardens and use ground cover to help retain water
- ⇒ water in the morning and late afternoon, not during the day in full sun
- ⇒ save "grey" water for gardens and/or outdoor cleaning (washing machine water for example)
- ⇒ plan for stock to have enough water and shade
- ⇒ have an emergency supply of drinking water on hand
- ⇒ pre-book water deliveries in advance, they could have long waiting lists this summer





DOC PREPARES FOR SELL-OUT CAMPING SUMMER

The Department of Conservation (DOC) is gearing up to host approximately 60,000 campers over the upcoming summer at more than 300 campsites spread across New Zealand. Popular holiday destinations include the Coromandel, Hauraki Gulf Islands, and Northland, some of which are expected to sell out during the peak summer season.

The cyclone recovery efforts have included repairing water infrastructure, rebuilding internal roads within the campsites, fixing bridges and culverts, repairing toilets, and clearing debris and fallen trees. "The main impact visitors will experience from last year's turbulent summer is reduced capacity of around 25-30 per cent at some Coromandel and Northland campsites."

DOC campsites are particularly popular through the peak Christmas-New Year season, and during any summer long weekend. They draw campers looking to enjoy fishing, swimming, boating and walking in sometimes isolated locations. Visitors planning to head to these locations are urged to go properly prepared and keep up to date with weather conditions and road network alerts, especially in the northern Coromandel.

Adjusted capacities for DOC Campsites:

Coromandel

Port Jackson: Reduced from 250 to 185 visitors. Fletcher Bay: Reduced from 300 to 200 visitors. Fantail Bay: Reduced from 80 to 60 visitors.

Whangarei

Uretiti Beach Campsite: reduced from 1000 to 750 visitors. Although floodwaters have receded over the past year, two main pools alongside the ring-road appear to be permanent.

DOC campsite availability for the upcoming summer:

Northland Campsites

Otamure Campsite: Full from December 24 to late January.

Puriri Campsite and Urupukapuka Campsite: Full from Dec 25 to end of first week of January.

Trounson Kauri Park Campsite, Puketi Campsite, Uretiti: All have space available for Christmas/New Year bookings.

Coromandel Campsites

Port Jackson Campsite, Fantail Bay Campsite, and Waikawau Bay Campsite: Full from December 25 to the end of the first week of January.

Fletcher Bay Campsite & Stoney Bay Campsite: available for Christmas/New Year bookings.

Kauaeranga Valley campsites: Plenty of capacity, but visitors are encouraged to book early, particularly for the busy Christmas-New Year period.

Inner Hauraki Gulf/Tīkapa Moana Campsites

Motuora Island Campsite: Full Dec 25 to the end of the first week of Jan. Pest Free Island.

Home Bay / Motutapu Island Campsite and Motuihe Campsite: Space available for Christmas/New Year bookings. Pest Free Islands.

Aotea/Great Barrier Island Campsites

Akapoua Bay, Awana Beach, The Green, Whangapoua, Harataonga, and Medlands Beach Campsites: All have space available for Christmas/New Year bookings.
